Enhance communication within the Church and to the public

Develop innovative missions to immigrant and aboriginal communities and promote intercultural congregations

At one time we needed to send missionaries thousands of miles from home to proclaim the Gospel to those who had not heard the Good News. Now those people are our neighbours. We look forward to building relationships with both new Canadians and aboriginal groups at home. With servant events and ongoing missions at home and internationally we will learn more about outreach so that our districts can grow new congregations.

Ensure the faithful articulation of our theology in a rapidly changing world

God's Word clearly speaks to everyday life in Canada. Our positions on social issues will be shared locally and nationally, and around the world through the Internet. Bible studies will help members of LCC congregations understand more about God's Word as it relates to our world.

Strengthen our Lutheran Education system

God has given LCC unique mission opportunities with children and youth through our Lutheran schools. We will create the organizational structure to give ongoing support and help create the environment for effective proclamation of the Gospel.

Enhance and strengthen board governance processes

God gives us minds to bring order to the work of His church. Through good governance practices, boards and committees at the congregation, district and synod can create the environment in which the Holy Spirit guides the work entrusted to us.




Great is Your faithfulness, O Lord!
